



2010/2011 International Selection Junior Grand Prix and Sr. International Events

ISU Junior Grand Prix Events / Senior International Events

- All skaters will be required to compete at a summer competition completing all portions of the event (SD, FD / SP, FP).
- Skaters' who have met the designated benchmark score and show potential for the target score in the 2010 summer competition season may be considered for an assignment.
- Athletes who, at a 2009-2010 international competition, scored higher than the 2009-2010 benchmark scores (Senior: M=170, L=130, P=140, D=150; Junior: M=150, L=115, P=115, D=130) may be considered for an early assignment, but must show readiness 30 days prior to keep the assignment.
- A "with potential for" target score has been set as a benchmark allowing for the fact that skaters do not necessarily peak at summer events. Skaters who have met or show the potential to meet this target score at a Junior Grand Prix or Sr. International event in the 2010 season will be given priority in the assignment considerations.
- Official entry lists are due to the ISU a minimum of 31 days prior to the start of each event.
- *Note – all benchmark scores have been adjusted to reflect the new 2010-2011 program requirements and the new Scale of Values.*

JGP Technical Requirements for Singles and Pairs

- Ladies:** Short - Triple combo, preference to those landing triple loop from steps
Free - Minimum of 4 triples (preference to 3 different triples)
- Men:** Short - Triple/triple combo, triple loop from steps;
Free - 6 triples (preference to those landing triple axel)
- Pairs:** Short - double axel, throw triple toe loop.
Free - Preference to triple jump and 2 throw triples.

Technical Element consistency must be demonstrated in all monitoring sessions.

*Skate Canada reserves the right to not fill all open entry spots. Only those skaters meeting the established criteria or who have placed in the top 4 at their first Junior Grand Prix event will be considered for an assignment.
